



Rookie Sportsman Rules

FOLLOW SPORTSMAN RULE PACKAGE

FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEM IS MANDATORY, ALL SYSTEMS MUST MEET OR EXCEED SFI 17.1 SPECIFICATION.

1. Rookie Sportsman is a feature only division. Feature races will be 12 laps.
2. Any driver who has recorded a Sportsman or Small Block Modified win will not be eligible for this division.
3. Season race points based on finish position will be accumulated to determine Rookie Champion.
4. Rookie Sportsman Division will run 5 shows beginning on 4/10 opening night. On 4/10 event drivers will draw for starting positions.
5. Week 2, Top 15 in points will be handicapped for Feature line up.
6. Week 3, Top 12 in points will be handicapped for Feature line up.
7. Week 4, Top 9 in points will be handicapped for Feature line up.
8. Week 5, Top 6 in points will be handicapped for Feature line up. This night will determine the Rookie Sportsman Champion for the 2021 season. All Rookie competitors will graduate into the Sportsman Division following this event for the remainder of the season. Rookie Sportsman Champion will be a guaranteed starter for the Sportsman Division's next 2 events. The actual date of Graduation event may vary at OCFS management's discretion depending on possible rain outs.
9. Rookie Sportsman Division is open to anyone who has qualified for 5 or less feature events in any OCFS open wheel division.
10. All safety and technical rules are outlined in the Sportsman section of the Orange County Fair Speedway Rules.
11. This is a 602 Crate engine class. Follow OCFS Sportsman rule package.
12. The rookie drivers cannot compete in Sportsman division races on the nights they are off until after graduation night.
13. A Sportsman race car can only compete in one class on a given night, Sportsman or Rookie Sportsman. One car cannot compete in both divisions on the same night.
